### WARNING

All CMS mission archive series have the same sets of letter-books, mission books etc. When giving references it is <u>essential</u> at all times to distinguish the series e.g. W [West Indies], CH [China], N [New Zealand] etc. An incomplete reference, such as L 1 (for first letter-book) or M 5 (fifth mission book) could refer to any of six African missions, three Indian missions, two Canadian missions and many others.

For the individual documents (as distinct from volumes) examples of correct references are given in the introduction.

### Introduction

### Arrangement and classification of the archive series

The Church Missionary Society is administered by a series of committees, the Secretaries of each of the main committees being the heads of departments at headquarters. The work has two main divisions, home [i.e. within the British Isles] and overseas.

The earliest committee in charge of overseas work was the Committee of Correspondence. It was set up in 1799 and directed the whole of the foreign work of the Society until 1880. It was often referred to, both in letters and printed papers, as the Parent Committee (or P.C.).

Each mission area, as soon as it was allocated a mission secretary, had its own administrative machinery of committees, conferences etc. At the same time it had its own series of correspondence at head-quarters. These series of papers and volumes are identical for each mission. From 1820 until 1880 the copies of outgoing letters were pasted into letter-books [/L] and the incoming papers were kept in bundles [/O]. The incoming material was copied into mission books [/M].

The archive reference numbers have been marked in pencil at the back of each individual item, E.G. C W/O 42/7.

### CMS West Indias mission

Mission work in the West Indies was begun in 1813 when William Dawes in Antigua offered to act as a CMS agent. A mission was established in Barbados in 1820, Jamaica in 1826, British Guiana in 1827 and Trinidad in 1836.

A severe financial crisis in 1839 forced the Society to decide to withdraw gradually from the work, handing over to the established Anglican church. Support for Antigua, Barbados, Jamaica and Trinidad ended officially at the end of 1849. Work in British Guiana continued until 1858.

### Mission books

The original papers [incoming 0 1-100] were copied into the mission books, so that a legible copy was available for the use of the committee. From 1820 to 1826 the papers are numbered in the order in which they arrived at headquarters and entered in order in the volumes (though not all items are so entered). This numbering system continues until 1839, though items are not entered in order and often are not numbered. The numbers in the book correspond with the numbers, often in red ink, on the letters.

The books consist of gatherings bound into volumes. The copying clerks wrote gathering by gathering so that the handwriting and the individual items are split between gatherings and even [M 2-3] between volumes.

The lettersand journals from 1820 to those received May 1849 are copied out in full, while a note of receipt is made for the financial papers [as distinct from finance letters] and printed papers. From 1849 onwards the letters only are so copied.

### Original papers

The original papers comprise all incoming papers sent to headquarters by the mission secretary (or occasionally directly from the missionaries and others). They consist mainly of letters, journals and reports, but include minutes and papers of local CMS committees. The papers were marked on arrival with the date of receipt and sometimes a date of answer and/or date on which the committee dealt with them. From 1820 to 1837 the papers were also numbered in red ink, in the order in which they arrived at headquarters. Some of them were initialled by the Secretary who read or dealt with them. The majority of the papers were then copied in full into the mission books [q.v.].

The papers appear to have been kept in wooden boxes, about ten years or so for each box. There were bundles of papers of various kinds such as correspondence with bishops, education papers, minutes of local CMS conferences etc., as well as letters and papers from These bundles have individuals. very largely been kept together by subject, but amalgamated by years. The main bulk of the papers, however, have been sorted according to the various individuals who wrote them and are arranged alphabetically.
